## **EXAMPLE OF WHAT TO INCLUDE IN YOUR FACEBOOK POST**

Upload a photo or video of your WW1



Accompany your photo or video with a blurb and credit.

This painting is of the Goulburn military camp which was established in 1915. This camp was where local men enlisted to join the army and the site for the initial training for local soldiers.

This painting is one of two almost identical paintings completed by Campbell of the Goulburn camp. Campbell was known as the '10 bob' painter and went around to various military camps to paint them. The work pictured is part of the collection of the Australian War Memorial in Canberra and the sister work is property of a local Goulburn family.
