


Always Was, Always Will Be.

Something to MAKE

DOT PAINTING

You will need:

- * Templates on next couple pages or a blank piece of paper to create your own dot paint design
- * Paints - red, yellow, black, white, blue
 - * Cotton bud or thin stick
 - * Painting shirt or smock
- * Something to cover the table in case you spill your paint



- 1) Ask mum or dad to print off one of the dot painting templates OR
- 2) Create your own design on a blank piece of paper
- 3) Put a cotton bud in each of your paint colours
- 4) Dot paint pictures



If you don't have any paint at home, ask mum or dad if they can help you make some

Recipe for Homemade Paint

You will need:

1/2 cup flour


1/2 cup salt

1/2 cup water


Food colouring

Instructions:


- 1) Mix flour and salt together
- 2) Add water and mix until smooth
- 3) Divide into bowls or recycled yoghurt/fruit containers
- 4) Add a few drops of food colouring to each and stir
- 5) Add a little more water if too thick




