### Salt dough pinch pots

In Afternoon Art Club, we get children making art.

Use your pantry staples to create a pinch pot for your special items.

#### You will need:

- Flour 2 cups
- Salt 1 cup
- Warm water 1 cup
- Paint or markers















#### Make your dough

Add one cup salt to one cup warm water (wait for water to cool before using). Stir to dissolve salt in water.

Add 2 cups flour a little bit at a time and stir.
When it becomes too stiff to stir, use clean hands to bring the dough together.

If the dough is too wet and sticky, knead in a little more flour. If it's too stiff, add a little more water. It should be easy to work with—soft and not too stiff and not excessively sticky.

#### Make your pinch pots

Make a ball with your dough. Insert your thumb and pinch the dough between your thumb and fingers. Rotate the ball and continue to pinch the sides creating a 'pot'.

Salt dough can air dry or pop into the oven for 90 mins – 2 hours at 100°C.













## Decorate your pinch pots

Use paint or markers to decorate your pinch pots.

To increase the life of your pinch pots, seal the pinch pots with varnish or lacquer.

#### **Extension activities**

- Try creating new forms with your dough. Salt dough is excellent for decorative items like Christmas decorations
- 2. Use the dough to model a character. Use a stop motion app like stop motion studio to animate your character
- 3. Purchase some air dry clay or try the activity with the real thing and organize it to be fired
