Let's get making!

What you'll need: Shredded Paper Large Bowl Flour Salt

Hot Water Hand Blender

Step 1

Fill your bowl with the shredded paper and hot water. Mix it around, adding more water if needed to make sure the paper is fully covered.

Leave overnight or a couple of hours.

Step 2

Your paper should be ready to blend. Using a hand mixer or electric mixer, pulp paper until it's completely broken down.

Squeeze to remove excess water.

Step 3

Add 1 part flour to 4 parts paper. Mix with hands.





Step 4

Now you are ready to create. Mold your paper clay into a shape or bowl or vase. Allow to dry.

Store left over paper clay in the fridge in an air tight container for 2 weeks.

A Bag and a Bird

What you'll need: Plastic bags Bottle lids



Step 1

Find plastic in your recycling bin. Spread it out on table to see what you have and think about what you could make using the pieces.

Step 2

Create pictures with your pieces. Green plastic bags can be grass, flower stems, water. Bottle lids can be flower petals, fish, a boat, funny face.

Step 3

Glue the pieces in place on some cardboard or move the pieces around to create another picture.
